



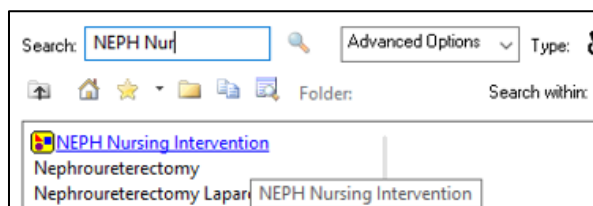
NURSING INTERVENTION POWERPLAN

HOSPITAL INFORMATION SYSTEM (HIS)

DIALYSIS NURSES

The **NEPH Nursing Intervention** PowerPlan will include ongoing nursing interventions and reminders for patient care. This will function similar to a Kardex, and must be updated with your patients most recent information. All current patients will have the PowerPlan on their chart, and it will need to be added to a patients' charts on their first treatment.

From the **Orders** tab, search for the **NEPH Nursing Intervention Powerplan**. Select the plan and click **Done**.



The PowerPlan is seen below. Some orders are auto-selected while some are not. Select and/or de-select the appropriate orders that apply to your patient.

Select the day of the week in which the dressing or foot check will be due.

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The **Physician Dialog** box will appear. Select **Clinical Intervention** as the **Communication Type**. This will ensure that the order does NOT route to the physician for co-sign.

Within the PowerPlan, *Hover to Discover* over the **Details** column to view the Special Instructions and/or Comments on any order. The Special Instructions field contains important information such as the **Frequency & Duration** of the intervention. Most orders will have default instructions or 'fill in the blank' sentences that you are able to adjust for each patient.

Certain orders have an associated **Powerform** that is to be completed. This will be written in the **Special Instructions**. These forms are found in your **AdHoc** folder on the grey toolbar.

Special Instructions: High risk patients: Every month on the 1st Monday of the month Please document on the Foot Assesment powerform.

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This Plan also includes **KCP Treatment/Special Instructions** Orders. These orders act as standing reminders for parallel nursing interventions that exist outside of the plan.

When modifying, leave the duration and duration unit(s) as is. This allows the plan to remain active for at least 365 days throughout the patient's treatment.





Important Note: The Orders in the Nursing Intervention PowerPlan will NOT appear as tasks in **Activities and Interventions**. Refer back to the PowerPlan in the **Orders** tab when reviewing or completing patient care.

You have the ability to modify orders in the plan itself, as well as after the plan has been initiated. Right click on the order and select **Modify**.

Other nursing interventions can be added to the plan as needed by selecting **Add to Phase** if they are ongoing dialysis interventions. Select **Add Order** and search for the order that is to be added to the plan (E.g. KCP Treatment/Special Instructions).

Click **Sign** and then refresh your screen. The PowerPlan is now active.

Please reference the following page to understand what details should be included in the **Order Comments** for each intervention in the Nursing Intervention Powerplan.



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Item in PowerPlan	What information to add in <i>Special Instructions/Order Comments</i> :
KCP Goals of Care	Add dates of when it was last done and will be due next (due yearly)
New Start Checklist	Write any tasks from checklist that are either pending or not done reference checklist in Ad hoc folder)
KCP Treatment/Special Instructions: <i>Monthly-Blood Work</i>	Add any extra labs that have been added and include the month they were done, and next due (e.g. Heps last done: February, next due: August)
KCP Treatment/Special Instructions: <i>ESA Management</i>	Write day of the week in which Aranesp is due (reference ESA PowerPlan) Add hemoglobin level as well as the date bloodwork was last completed. Note if Aranesp is on hold, etc...
KCP Treatment/Special Instructions: <i>Med Rec. Review</i>	Add when it was last done and when it will be due next.
KCP Treatment/Special Instructions: <i>Warfarin Protocol</i>	Add day of the week in which it is due (reference Warfarin Protocol PowerPlan)
Cytotoxic Antibodies	Add when it was last done and will be due next (Done: Feb, Due: Mar.) Enter the following reminder "Once drawn, order for next month."
CVC Dressing Change	Include instructions and supplies.
Code Status (Add KCP Treatment Special/Instructions Order)	Goals of Care documentation can be found in Form Browser. Navigate to the patient's home encounter to view past documentation on code status.
Additional KCP Treatment/Special Instructions (Belongings, Weight, AVF info, vascular access updates, etc...)	Enter a new KCP Treatment/Special Instructions Order (+ Add to Phase) and include details in Order Comments. Choose frequency 'q dialysis' Enter duration of 365 days.
