Description: From the Inpatient Workflow MPage, navigate to Home Medications component and click "Admission"

Decision [8]

Description: Is the medication a home or inpatient medication?

Comments: Inpatient Medication(s) will only pull into the Admission Medication Reconciliation window if someone has already placed clinical medication orders for the hospital (hospital icon). These will automatically default to the Continue column in the Meds Rec window because the system knows that the medication(s) order was placed on this encounter.

If the Admission Meds Rec is done before any clinical orders are placed on the encounter,

only documented Home Medications will pull into this window. The physician will need to manually indicate via the Continue/Do Not Continue Radio Buttons whether or not an Inpatient order should be generated for that medication.

Description: Existing inpatient med is continued with same dose, route & frequency? Value Impact: Patient Safety Quality

Decision [42]

Description: Is the medication a home or inpatient medication?



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Decision [10]

Description: Does an inpatient order for this med already exist?

Value Impact: Quality

Comments: If med requires therapeutic substitution, select the desired form of the therapeutic sub or defer to pharmacy to manage.

Decision [16]

Description: Is there also a home med order for the same med?

Decision [17]

Description: Does Inpatient order have desired dose, route & frequency?

Work Step [11]

Description: Select Continue on the Home meds

Decision [15]

Description: Does Inpatient order have desired dose, route & frequency?

Work Step [47]

Description: Select Do Not Continue. Home med will remain on list for subsequent reconciliation

Work Step [49]

Description: Inpatient med has defaulted to Continue, select Do Not Continue instead, and medication will be discontinued

Decision [107]

Description: Is the Home Med automatically therapeutically substituted?

Work Step [109]

Description: Select the appropriate substitution or defer to pharmacy (using the Nonform med)

Comments: The Therapeutic Substitution Dialog Box will contain a list of medication options that are considered therapeutic substitutions for the home medication that you are trying to convert to an inpatient medication. The prescriber can select from one of these medications or they can select the "NonForm med" option to have pharmacy make the substitution for them.



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Work Step [13]

Description: Continue Inpatient order

Comments: Home med will still be available to continue at discharge.

Inpatient Medications should automatically continue on the Admission Meds Rec window (because they were ordered on this encounter)

Work Step [14]

Description: Inpatient order has defaulted to continue

Decision [50]

Description: Are there additional orders to reconcile?

Decision [56]

Description: Reconciliation completed

Work Step [18]

Description: New Inpatient med is created from home med, and adjust order details if needed

Comments: If home med details are not known, no action is needed. Incomplete order will be referred to pharmacy to help resolve home med details and apply to the new inpatient order.

Work Step [103]

Description: Select Add to create new inpatient order. Dose, route & frequency can't be modified, select do not continue on the incorrect order

Comments: If the dose and/or route information on the medication are incorrect, a new order should always be placed.

Work Step [19]

Description: Existing inpatient med is continued with same dose, route & frequency

Work Step [20]

Description: Dose, route & frequency cannot be modified, select do not continue, select add to create new inpatient order

Start/Stop [58]

Description: Select Reconcile and "Sign".
